1. Definitions

- 1.1 "Seller" shall mean West-Trak Equipment Ltd and its successors and assigns.
- 1.2 "Buyer" shall mean the Buyer or any person acting on behalf of and with the authority of the Buyer.
- 1.3 "Guarantor" means that person (or persons), or entity that agrees herein to be liable for the debts of the Buyer on a principal debtor basis.
- 1.4 "Goods" shall have the same meaning as in section 2 of the Sale of Goods Act 1908 and are goods supplied by the Seller to the Buyer (and where the context so permits shall include any supply of Services as hereinafter defined).
- 1.5 "Services" shall mean all services supplied by the Seller to the Buyer and includes any advice or recommendations (and where the context so permits shall include any supply of Goods as defined supra).
- 1.6 "Price" shall mean the cost of the goods as agreed between the Seller and the Buyer subject to clause 4 of this contract.

2. Acceptance

- 2.1 Any instructions received by the Seller from the Buyer for the supply of Goods shall constitute acceptance of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 2.2 Where more than one Buyer has entered into this agreement, the Buyers shall be jointly and severally liable for all payments of the Price.
- 2.3 Upon acceptance of these terms and conditions by the Buyer the terms and conditions are irrevocable and can only be rescinded in accordance with these terms and conditions or with the written consent of the manager of the Seller.
- 2.4 None of the Seller's agents or representatives are authorised to make any representations, statements, conditions or agreements not expressed by the manager of the Seller in writing nor is the Seller bound by any such unauthorised statements.
- 2.5 The Buyer undertakes to give the Seller not less than seven (7) days prior written notice of any proposed change in the Buyer's name and/or any other change in the Buyer's details (including but not limited to, changes in the Buyer's address, facsimile number, or business practice).
- 2.6 That for the purposes of the Construction Contracts Act 2002 this contract is not a commercial construction contract or a construction contract whether for a commercial or residential property or work and devise liability under this contract shall be in no way limited by any contract that the Buyer may have entered into with a third party in relation to the supply of Goods and/or Services to that third party or the payment by the third party to the Buyer of any monies whether by progress payments or otherwise.

3. Goods / Services

- 3.1 The Goods and/or Services are as described on the invoices, quotation, work authorisation or any other work commencement forms as provided by the Seller to the Buyer.

4. Price And Payment

- 4.1 At the Sellers sole discretion;
- (a) The Price shall be as indicated on invoices provided by the Seller to the Buyer in respect of Goods supplied; or
- (b) The Price shall be the Seller's current price at the date of delivery of the Goods according to the Sellers current Price list; or
- (c) The Price of the Goods shall, subject to clause 4.2, be the Sellers quoted Price,
- 4.2 The Seller may by giving notice to the Buyer at any time up to seven (7) days before delivery increase the Price of the Goods to reflect any increase in the cost to the Seller beyond the reasonable control of the Seller. (including, without limitation, foreign exchange fluctuations, taxes and duties, provisions of any Acts, By-Law, Order or Regulation of any parliament, municipality or local authority enacted after the date of contract between the Buyer and Seller and the cost of labour, materials and other manufacturing costs).
- 4.3 At the Seller's sole discretion a deposit may be required. The deposit amount or percentage of the Price will be stipulated at the time of the order of the Goods/Services and shall become immediately due and payable.
- 4.4 Time for payment for the Goods shall be of the essence and will be stated on the invoice, quotation or any other order forms. If no time is stated then payment shall be due for export Clients payment will be due thirty (30) days following the date of the invoice/shipment date; and
- (b) for approved New Zealand Clients payment shall be due on the 20th of each month following the posting of a statement to the Buyer's address or address for notices.
- 4.5 Payment will be made by cheque, or by bank cheque, or by direct credit, or by Letters of Credit, or by any other method as agreed to between the Buyer and the Seller.
- 4.6 The Price shall be increased by the amount of any GST and other taxes and duties, which may be applicable, except to the extent that such taxes are expressly included in any quotation given by the Seller.

5. Delivery Of Goods

- 5.1 Delivery of the Goods shall be made to the Buyer's nominated address. The Buyer shall make all arrangements necessary to take delivery of the Goods whenever they are tendered for delivery
- 5.2 Delivery of the Goods to a carrier, either named by the Buyer or failing such naming to a carrier at the discretion of the Seller for the purpose of transmission to the Buyer, is deemed to be a delivery of the Goods to the Buyer.
- 5.3 The Seller may deliver the Goods by separate instalments (in accordance with the agreed delivery schedule). Each separate instalment shall be invoiced and paid for in accordance with the provisions in this contract of sale.
- 5.4 Delivery of the Goods to a third party nominated by the Buyer is deemed to be delivery to the Buyer for the purposes of this agreement.
- 5.5 The Buyer shall take delivery of the Goods tendered notwithstanding that the quantity so delivered shall be either greater or less than the quantity purchased provided that;
- (a) such discrepancy in quantity shall not exceed 5%, and
- (b) the Price shall be adjusted pro rata to the discrepancy.
- 5.6 The failure of the Seller to deliver shall not entitle either party to treat this contract as repudiated.
- 5.7 The Seller shall not be liable for any loss or damage whatsoever due to failure by the Seller to deliver the Goods (or any of them) promptly or at all.

6. Risk

- 6.1 If the Seller retains property in the Goods nonetheless all risk for the Goods passes to the Buyer on delivery.
- 6.2 If any of the Goods are damaged or destroyed prior to property in them passing to the Buyer, the Seller is entitled, without prejudice to any of its other rights or remedies under these terms and conditions (including the right to receive payment of the balance of the Price for the Goods), to receive all insurance proceeds payable in respect of the Goods. This applies whether or not the Price has become payable under these terms and conditions. The production of these terms and conditions by the Seller is sufficient evidence of the Seller's rights to receive the insurance proceeds without the need for any person dealing with the Seller to make further enquiries.

7. Defects/Returns

- 7.1 The Buyer shall inspect the Goods on delivery and shall within fourteen (14) days of delivery notify the Seller of any alleged defect, shortage in quantity, damage or failure to comply with the description or quote. The Buyer shall afford the Seller an opportunity to inspect the Goods within a reasonable time following delivery if the Buyer believes the Goods are defective in any way. If the Buyer shall fail to comply with these provisions the Goods shall be conclusively presumed to be in accordance with the terms and conditions and free from any defect or damage.
- 7.2 For defective Goods which the Seller has agreed in writing that the Buyer is entitled to reject, the Seller's liability is limited to either (at the Seller's discretion) replacing the Goods or repairing the Goods provided that the Buyer has complied with the provisions of clause 7.1.

8 Manufactured Goods - Terms, Conditions and Warranty

- 8.1 The supply by the Seller of all manufactured Goods or orders for manufactured Goods shall be subject to the terms, conditions and warranty outlined in this clause 8. The terms and conditions of trade contained in the rest of this document apply so long as they are not inconsistent with the specific provisions included in clause 8.
- 8.2 **General terms and conditions for Manufactured Goods and orders**
- 8.2.1 Drawings, dimensions, weights, capacities, specifications and performances given or included by the Seller are approximate only and no warranty is expressed or may be implied by the provision of them and the Buyer undertakes to check all such drawings, dimensions, weights, capacities, specifications and performances to ensure that they are correct to the Buyer's purposes.
- 8.2.2 All documentation and price lists supplied by the Seller are confidential and shall remain the property of the Seller and no part of any such documentation shall be divulged to another party or parties without the prior written consent of the Seller.
- 8.2.3 The Buyer is responsible for the correct installation, operation and maintenance of the Seller's manufactured Goods .
- 8.2.4 All goods are supplied on the express condition that the goods will be used in accordance with any provided layout drawings, load tables, specifications or published Good information brochures
- 8.2.5 All orders and instructions issued to the Seller by the Buyer or his agents or servants by telephone are to be confirmed in writing to the Seller within 3 days.
- 8.2.6 Should a form of packaging other than that normally used by the Seller be specified, additional charges will be incurred.
- 8.2.7 The Seller is entitled to rely on the representations and actions of the Buyer's employees and/or agents as being binding on the Buyer.
- 8.2.8 The Seller shall not in any way be liable for any loss or damage suffered as a result of any delay or failure to effect delivery of the goods.
- 8.2.9 All goods shall be at the risk of the Buyer from the time they are placed in the vehicle which is to effect delivery from the Seller's premises and the Buyer has the responsibility at its expenses and without recourse to the Seller to collect and transport the goods from the Seller's premises and to keep the goods insured from the time at which risk passes to the Buyer.
- 8.2.10 Subject to any terms and conditions, warranties and indemnities implied by law which by law cannot be excluded, restricted, limited or modified. The Seller shall not be liable for any loss or damage of any kind whatsoever (including injury or death to persons or loss of damage to property) and whether suffered or incurred by the Buyer or a third person or persons where such loss or damage arises directly or indirectly from the goods or any information or assistance or other services supplied by the Seller including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing any financial loss or damage. The Buyer shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Seller from all losses, claims, actions, demands, proceedings, damages, costs, charges and expenses in respect of or in relation to the death or injury to or illness of any person or persons or loss of or damage to property caused by or in connection with or arising out of the use of the goods, information, assistance or other services or in the employment of any persons in connection therewith. This includes consequential damages or losses.

8.3 Quotations for Manufactured Goods and orders

- 8.3.1 All quotations given by the Seller are subject to acceptance by the Buyer within 21 days of the date of the quotation, unless otherwise specified in the quotation.
- 8.3.2 Prices quoted for all Goods are subject to variation by the Seller after the expiration of any time limit imposed in quotations supplied by the Seller.
- 8.3.3 The Seller may amend any quotation or price if;
- (a) The Seller suffers any cost increase which is beyond its control in the supply, manufacture or delivery of the product between the date of the quotation and the date of delivery; or
- (b) If the Buyer varies or alters the specifications of the quotation or the requirements of the product; or
- (c) If a significant error of fact can be shown in the original quotation.
- 8.3.4 The Seller may withdraw any quotation before the Customer's signed acceptance.

8.4 Warranty of Manufactured Goods

- 8.4.1 This warranty covers the replacement or repair of any Goods that have a manufacturing or structural defect in material or workmanship within 12 months (365 days) or 2000 hours of operation whichever comes first from the day of delivery to the Buyer subject to the exclusions in sub-clause 8.4.2 and clause 8.5
- 8.4.2 The Seller may amend the warranty period in clause 8.4.1 at their discretion based on the material density, rock size/weight and impact level of the site application/working conditions.
- 8.4.3 The Buyer shall notify the Seller within 30 days of the failure or breakdown of any Goods covered under this Warranty. Claims received outside 30 days will be at the discretion of the Seller.
- 8.4.4 The Seller reserves the right to repair or replace defective Goods. The Buyer shall not attempt to repair the goods without the prior written approval of the Seller. Repair work may be carried out at the Seller's own premises or any location or by any contractor that the Seller considers appropriate.
- 8.4.5 Repairs subject to a warranty claim require approval from the Seller prior to commencing work and repairs. Any work carried out without notifying the Seller will not be reimbursed and may void the remaining warranty.
- 8.4.6 If requested by the Seller, parts subject to a warranty claim must be returned within 30 days of the claim. Failure to do so will void the warranty claim.
- 8.4.7 The Seller's obligation is limited to the defective item(s). The Seller accepts no responsibility for the operation or effectiveness of any system, design or plan in which its Goods are placed.

8.4.8 Any Goods repaired or replaced under this warranty shall retain the warranty period pertaining to the Goods ' original date of delivery.

8.4.9 The warranty is non-transferable if the Goods are on-sold.

8.4.10 The Seller reserves the right to require a third party assessment (i.e a recognised metallurgist) to determine the cause or causes of any product failure. In the event that the cause is determined to be the fault of the Customer, the Seller will not be liable.

8.5 Warranty exclusions

8.5.1 The Warranty specifically excludes the following:

- (a) Parts or accessories that are warranted directly to the Buyer by third-party manufacturers.
- (b) Failure as a result of, or Goods which have been subjected to, incorrect installation, negligence, misuse, lack of maintenance/servicing, handling which is contrary to or outside of normal use or the Goods or failure which is due to the fault of the Buyer.
- (c) Goods which have been modified, incorrectly adjusted or operated, used with inappropriate accessories, altered or repaired by others without prior authorisation by the Seller.
- (d) Continued use of any Goods after any defect becomes apparent or should become apparent to a reasonably prudent operator or user.
- (e) Defects which are of a cosmetic or non-substantial nature (in the Seller's opinion).
- (f) Costs associated with the removal or re-installation of the Goods or machine downtime or loss of production.
- (g) Personal injury or property damage caused by Goods failure, persons, place, or machine.
- (h) General wear and tear, and failure or defect of Goods as a result of general wear and tear or a natural characteristic of the material used (e.g wear and tear on pins and bushings and components such as teeth, heel shrouds, liners, wear strips, side protectors, lip protectors etc).
- (i) Goods that are sold as seconds, repaired Goods or Goods that have a defect where that has been drawn to the Buyer's attention prior to purchase.
- (j) Applications where the Material density, rock size/weight or impact levels have exceeded the original equipment manufacturers (OEM) recommendations.
- (k) When bottom rollers have been fitted as a part set, or replaced as singles, warranty is void. Bottom rollers need to be fitted new in full sets.

8.6 Return Policy of Manufactured Goods

8.6.1 Returns will only be accepted in accordance with these terms and conditions.

8.6.2 Manufactured Goods ordered specifically by the Buyer are not returnable or refundable.

9. Consumer Guarantees Act 1993

9.1 This agreement is subject, in all cases except where the Buyer is contracting within the terms of a trade/business (which cases are specifically excluded), to the provisions of the Consumer Guarantees Act 1993.

10. Default & Consequences of Default

10.1 Interest on overdue invoices shall accrue from the date when payment becomes due daily until the date of payment at a compounding rate of 2% per calendar month and shall accrue at such a rate after as well as before any judgement.

10.2 If the Buyer defaults in payment of any invoice when due, the Buyer shall indemnify the Seller from and against all of the Seller's costs and disbursements including on a solicitor and own client basis and in addition all of the Seller's nominees costs of collection.

10.3 Without prejudice to any other remedies the Seller may have, if at any time the Buyer is in breach of any obligation (including those relating to payment), the Seller may suspend or terminate the supply of Goods to the Buyer and any of its other obligations under the terms and conditions. The Seller will not be liable to the Buyer for any loss or damage the Buyer suffers because the Seller exercised its rights under this clause.

10.4 In the event that:

- (a) any money payable to the Seller becomes overdue, or in the Seller's opinion the Buyer will be unable to meet its payments as they fall due, or;
- (b) the Buyer becomes insolvent, convenes a meeting with its creditors or proposes or enters into an arrangement with creditors, or makes an assignment for the benefit of its creditors, or;
- (c) a receiver, manager, liquidator (provisional or otherwise) or similar person is appointed in respect of the Buyer or any asset of the Buyer, then without prejudice to the Seller's other remedies at law
 - (i) the Seller shall be entitled to cancel all or any part of any order of the Buyer which remains unperformed in addition to and without prejudice to any other remedies; and
 - (ii) all amounts owing to the Seller shall, whether or not due for payment, immediately become due and payable.

11. Title

11.1 It is the intention of the Seller and agreed by the Buyer that property in the goods shall not pass until:

- (a) The Buyer has paid all amounts owing for the particular Goods, and
- (b) The Buyer has met all other obligations due by the Buyer to the Seller in respect of all contracts between the Seller and the Buyer, and that the Goods, or proceeds of the sale of the Goods, shall be kept separate until the Seller shall have received payment and all other obligations of the Buyer are met.

11.2 It is further agreed that:

- (a) Until such time as ownership of the Goods shall pass from the Seller to the Buyer the Seller may give notice in writing to the Buyer to return the Goods or any of them to the Seller. Upon such notice the rights of the Buyer to obtain ownership or any other interest in the Goods shall cease.
- (b) If the Buyer fails to return the Goods to the Seller then the Seller or the Seller's agent may enter upon and into land and premises owned, occupied or used by the Buyer, or any premises as the invitee of the Buyer, where the Goods are situated and take possession of the Goods, without being responsible for any damage thereby caused.
- (c) If any part of the goods shall become incorporated into any other machinery, plant, equipment or other property so as to lose its separate identity then the title of that proportion of the machinery, plant, equipment or other property so integrated equal in value to the Price owed to the Seller shall be reserved and vested in the Seller until all money owed by the Buyer to the Seller has been paid in full.

12. Personal Property Securities Act 1999

12.1 Upon assenting to these terms and conditions in writing the Buyer acknowledges and agrees that:

- (a) These terms and conditions constitute a security agreement for the purposes of the PPSA; and
 - (b) A security interest is taken in all Goods previously supplied by the Seller to the Buyer (if any) and all Goods that will be supplied in the future by the Seller to the Buyer during the continuance of the parties relationship;
- 12.2 The Buyer undertakes to:
- (a) sign any further documents and/or provide any further information, such information to be complete, accurate and up-to-date in all respects, which the Seller may reasonably require to register a financing statement or financing change statement on the Personal Property Securities Register;
 - (b) indemnify, and upon demand reimburse, the Seller for all expenses incurred in registering a financing statement or financing change statement on the Personal Property Securities Register or releasing any Goods charged thereby;
 - (c) not register a financing change statement or a change demand without the prior written consent of the Seller;
 - (d) give the Seller not less than fourteen (14) days prior written notice of any proposed change in the Buyer's name and/or any other change in the Buyer's details (including but not limited to, changes in the Buyer's address, facsimile number, or business practice); and
 - (e) immediately advise the Seller of any material change in its business practices of selling the Goods which would result in a change in the nature of proceeds derived from such sales.
 - (f) The Seller and the Buyer agree that nothing in sections 114(1)(a), 133 and 134 of the PPSA shall apply to these Terms and Conditions.
 - (g) The Buyer waives its rights as a debtor under sections 116, 120(2), 121, 125, 126, 127, 129, 131 and 132 of the PPSA.
- 12.3 Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Seller, the Buyer waives its right to receive a verification statement in accordance with section 148 of the PPSA.
- 12.4 The Buyer unconditionally ratifies any actions taken by the Seller under and by virtue of the power of attorney given by the Buyer to the Seller under clauses 12.1 to 12.3.

13. Security & Charge

13.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein or any other rights which the Seller may have howsoever:

- (a) Where the Buyer and/or the Guarantor (if any) is the owner of land, realty or any other asset capable of being charged, both the Buyer and/or the Guarantor agree to mortgage and/or charge all of their joint and/or several interest in the said land, realty or any other asset to the Seller or the Seller's nominee to secure all amounts and other monetary obligations payable under the terms and conditions. The Buyer and/or the Guarantor acknowledge and agree that the Seller (or the Seller's nominee) shall be entitled to lodge where appropriate a caveat, which caveat shall be released once all payments and other monetary obligations payable hereunder have been met.
- (b) Should the Seller elect to proceed in any manner in accordance with this clause and/or its sub-clauses, the Buyer and/or Guarantor shall indemnify the Seller from and against all the Seller's costs and disbursements including legal costs on a solicitor and own client basis.
- (c) To give effect to the provisions of clause [12, 13.1(a) to (b)] inclusive hereof the Buyer and/or the Guarantor (if any) do hereby irrevocably nominate constitute and appoint the Seller or the Seller's nominee as the Buyer's and/or Guarantor's true and lawful attorney to execute mortgages and charges (whether registrable or not) including such other terms and conditions as the Seller and/or the Seller's nominee shall think fit in his/her/its/their absolute discretion against the joint and/or several interest of the Buyer and/or the Guarantor in any land, realty or asset in favour of the Seller and in the Buyer's and/or Guarantor's name as may be necessary to secure the said Buyer's and/or Guarantor's obligations and indebtedness to the Seller and further to do and perform all necessary and other acts including instituting any necessary legal proceedings, and further to execute all or any documents in the Seller's absolute discretion which may be necessary or advantageous to give effect to the provisions of this clause.

14. Intellectual Property

14.1 Where the Seller has designed or drawn Goods for the Buyer, then the copyright in those designs and drawings shall remain vested in the Seller, and shall only be used by the Buyer at the Seller's discretion.

14.2 Conversely, in such a situation, where the Buyer has supplied drawings, the Seller in its sale conditions may look for an indemnity (the specifications and design of the Goods (including the copyright, design right or other intellectual property in them) shall as between the parties be the property of the Seller).

14.3 Where any designs or specifications have been supplied by the Buyer for manufacture by or to the order of the Seller then the Buyer warrants that the use of those designs or specifications for the manufacture, processing, assembly or supply of the Goods shall not infringe the rights of any third party.

15. Cancellation

15.1 The Seller may cancel these terms and conditions or cancel delivery of Goods and Services at any time before the Goods are delivered by giving written notice. On giving such notice the Seller shall promptly repay to the Buyer any sums paid in respect of the Price for those Goods. The Seller shall not be liable for any loss or damage whatsoever arising from such cancellation.

15.2 At the Sellers sole discretion the Buyer may cancel delivery of Goods and/or Services. In the event that the Buyer cancels delivery of Goods and/or Services the Buyer shall be liable for any costs incurred by the Seller up to the time of cancellation.

16. Privacy Act 1993

16.1 The Buyer and the Guarantor/s (if separate to the Buyer) authorises the Seller to collect, retain and use any information about the Buyer, for the purpose of assessing the Buyers creditworthiness or marketing any Goods and Services provided by the Seller to any other party.

16.2 The Buyer authorises the Seller to disclose any information obtained to any person for the purposes set out in clause 16.1

16.3 Where the Buyer is a natural person the authorities under (clause 16.1 & 16.2) are authorities or consents for the purposes of the Privacy Act 1993.

17. Buyers Disclaimer

- 17.1 The Buyer hereby disclaims any right to rescind, or cancel the contract or to sue for damages or to claim restitution arising out of any misrepresentation made to him by any servant or agent of the Seller and the Buyer acknowledges that he buys the Goods relying solely upon his own skill and judgement and that the Seller shall not be bound by nor responsible for any term, condition, representation or warranty other than the warranty given by the Manufacturer which warranty shall be personal to the Buyer and shall not be transferable to any subsequent Buyer.

18. Contractual Remedies Act

- 18.1 The provisions of the Contractual Remedies Act 1979 shall apply to this contract as if Section 15(d) of the Act which states that nothing in the Act shall affect the Sale of Goods Act 1908 were omitted from the Contractual Remedies Act 1979.

19. Unpaid Sellers Rights To Dispose Of Goods

- 19.1 In the event that:
- (a) the Seller retains possession or control of the Goods; and
 - (b) payment of the Price is due to the Seller; and
 - (c) the Seller has made demand in writing of the Buyer for payment of the Price in terms of this contract; and
 - (d) the Seller has not received the Price of the Goods,
- then, whether the property in the Goods has passed to the Buyer or has remained with the Seller, the Seller may dispose of the Goods and may claim from the Buyer the loss to the Seller on such disposal.

20. Lien

- 20.1 Where the Seller has not received or been tendered the whole of the price, or the payment has been dishonoured, the Seller shall have:
- (a) a lien on the goods;
 - (b) the right to retain them for the price while the Seller is in possession of them;
 - (c) a right of stopping the goods in transit whether or not delivery has been made or ownership has passed; and
 - (d) a right of resale,
 - (e) the foregoing right of disposal,
- provided that the lien of the Seller shall continue despite the commencement of proceedings or judgement for the price having been obtained

21. Export Contracts

- 21.1 In the event that the Goods are exported, delivery of the Goods may be subject to either FOB Contract or CIF Contract.
- 21.2 In the event of a FOB Contract the following shall apply:
- (a) The Goods shall be delivered to the Buyer by delivery on board the agreed upon mode of transport on the delivery date. The Seller shall promptly notify the Buyer that the Goods have been delivered aboard. Title to and risk in the Goods shall pass to the Buyer upon such delivery being affected. The Seller shall promptly provide the Buyer with a clean shipped bill of lading in respect of the Goods.
 - (b) The Buyer shall reserve the necessary space on board the agreed upon mode of transport and give the Seller due notice of the loading berth and any revised delivery dates. The Buyer shall bear any additional costs caused due to the failure of the agreed upon mode of transport to be available to load the Goods on the delivery date.
- 21.3 In the event of a CIF contract the following shall apply:
- (a) The Goods shall be delivered to the Buyer by delivery on board the agreed upon mode of transport on or before the delivery date. The Seller shall procure a contract of carriage and insure the Goods from dispatch until delivery on terms current in the trade for the benefit of the Buyer. The Goods shall be at the risk of the Buyer as they are loaded on board. The Seller shall promptly tender to the Buyer a clean shipped bill of lading, the insurance policy and an invoice in respect of the Goods.
 - (b) The Buyer shall accept the documents tendered by the Seller if they correspond to this contract and take delivery of the Goods at the port of destination and bear all other costs and charges arising out of shipment of the Goods to the port of destination.

22. General

- 22.1 If any provision of these terms and conditions shall be invalid, void or illegal or unenforceable the validity existence, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected, prejudiced or impaired.
- 22.2 All Goods and Services supplied by the Seller are subject to the laws of New Zealand and the Seller takes no responsibility for changes in the law that affect the Goods or Services supplied.
- 22.3 The Seller shall be under no liability whatsoever to the Buyer for any indirect loss and/or expense (including loss of profit) suffered by the Buyer arising out of a breach by the Seller of these terms and conditions.
- 22.4 In the event of any breach of this contract by the Seller the remedies of the Buyer shall be limited to damages. Under no circumstances shall the liability of the Seller exceed the Price of the Goods.
- 22.5 Neither party shall be liable for any default due to any act of God, terrorism, war, strike, lock out, industrial action, flood, storm or other event beyond the reasonable control of either party.
- 22.6 The Buyer shall not set off against the Price amounts due from the Seller.
- 22.7 The Seller may license or sub-contract all or any part of its rights and obligations without the Buyer's consent.
- 22.8 The Seller reserves the right to review these terms and conditions at any time and from time to time. If, following any such review, there is to be any change in such terms and conditions, that change will take effect from the date on which the Seller notifies the Buyer of such change.

23. Guarantee

- 23.1 Where the individual who has completed the Credit Application Form is acting on behalf of a entity or other body, by signing the Credit Application Form and thereby accepting these terms and conditions of trade on behalf of that entity or other body the individual who completed the Credit Application Form is agreeing to be personally liable and guarantee:
- (a) Any monies owed by that entity or other body to West-Trak Equipment Limited, and
 - (b) Due performance of the terms and conditions of trade; and
 - (c) Warrants that they have authority to bind and will, in any event, be personally liable for the performance of the obligations. The person signing hereby indemnifies West-Trak Equipment Limited against all losses and costs that may be incurred arising out of the person signing the Credit Application Form failing to have such power or authority
